Florida pedestrian fatality rates are nearly double the national average and bicycle fatality rates are nearly triple the national average. Jacksonville has had the highest accident and fatality rates in the nation.

If a pedestrian is struck by a car going 25 mph or slower, the odds of survival are good. At speeds above 35 mph, the impact is likely to be fatal. Follow posted speed limits and observe all School Zone postings and help save lives.
